

## PRINCE2® Registered Practitioner (includes Foundation)

This accredited course is designed to enable delegates to apply PRINCE2 to the running and managing of a project within an environment supporting PRINCE2. Successful candidates will achieve both Foundation and Practitioner status. The first three days of the course concentrate on the method and is designed to give delegates an in-depth understanding of the principles and terminology of PRINCE2 as applied to various scenario's. Delegates will sit the Foundation course on at the end of the third day. The Foundation exam is a one hour closed book multi-choice exam. The fourth day is used as a mentoring revision and review session for the Practitioner examination which takes place on the last day of the course. The Practitioner exam is a three hour open-book (PRINCE2 manual only) exam.

### Course duration

5 days. Recommended 15 hours pre-study time required.

### Who should attend?

Project staff wishing to demonstrate a recognised level of competence in project management or who are required to play a role in a project conducted in accordance with the PRINCE2 method.

### Course content

- Overview and principles
- Organisation, business case
- Change control & controls
- The management of risk, quality in a project environment
- Plans & processes
- Configuration management
- Product-based planning, quality review

### Pre-requisites

Ideally a minimum of 1 to 2 years experience in a project environment as a senior manager, project manager, project/team leader or end-user.

### Course style

The course is designed to be interactive, with opportunities for discussion. The course devotes time for group-based case studies and exercises. All delegates are provided with the PRINCE2 manual and a Provek pre-study workbook prior to the workshop. Delegates will be required to do evening work during the week of the course. Numbers on each course is limited to ensure the highest quality and level of delegate participation.

### Course objectives

Delegates will be able to:

- Describe the purpose and major content of all roles, the eight components, the eight processes, and the techniques.
- State which management products are input to, output from, and updated in the eight processes, and the sub-processes of Controlling a Stage (CS) and Managing Product Delivery (MP).
- State the main purpose, and key contents, of the major management products as identified in the detailed syllabus.
- State the relationships between processes, deliverables, roles and the management dimensions of a project.

In addition, Practitioner level delegates will be able to:

- Produce detailed explanations of all processes, components and techniques, and worked examples of all PRINCE2 products as they might be applied to address the particular circumstances of a given project scenario.
- Demonstrate that they understand the relationships between processes, components, techniques and PRINCE2 products and can apply this understanding.
- Demonstrate that they understand the reasons behind the processes, components and techniques of PRINCE2, and that they understand the principles underpinning these elements.
- Demonstrate their ability to tune PRINCE2 to different project circumstances.
